



COVID Final Analysis as of 7/8

- Sequim Operational Area (CCFD 3) after 6 months adults only is 70%+ vaccinated* OUR OBJECTIVE
- 85% of 65+ are vaccinated in the County
- Whole County is at 74.2% for adults only with West End and Port Angeles trailing Sequim
 - Public Health needs PSA campaign, Pop-up Clinics & Pharmacies to finish the job
 - At least July or later, whether county can achieve 70% vaccination of *total population* (Federal Objective)
 - Will need to vaccinate 12-16 year-olds to even reach 70%+ *total population* number
