CCFD3 Certificate for Meritorious Action

The CCFD#3 Certificate of Merit is awarded to CERT members in recognition of lifesaving efforts by the member. Evidence of eligible actions must be documented to show a lifesaving effort, i.e. in a news release or in a signed witness letter.

Red Cross National Lifesaving Award

Nominees must have used any lifesaving skill taught by the American Red Cross during an incident, such as: first aid, CPR, using an AED or epinephrine auto-injector, giving back blows and abdominal thrusts or even calling 9-1-1 and providing care.

The national Lifesaving awards are issued by American Red Cross headquarters in Washington, D.C.

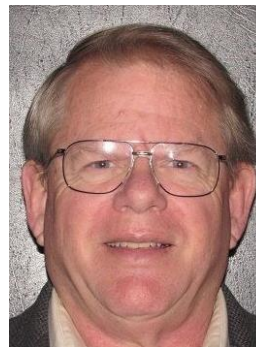

COVID Final Analysis as of 7/8

- Sequim Operational Area (CCFD 3) after 6 months **adults only is 70%+ vaccinated* - OUR OBJECTIVE**
- 85% of 65+ are vaccinated in the County
- Whole County is at 74.2% for *adults only* with West End and Port Angeles trailing Sequim
 - Public Health needs PSA campaign, Pop-up Clinics & Pharmacies to finish the job
 - At least July or later, whether county can achieve 70% vaccination of *total population* (Federal Objective)
 - Will need to vaccinate 12-16 year-olds to even reach 70%+ *total population* number
