Good Morning Emergency Managers, Police Chiefs, Fire Chiefs, Sheriffs, Tribal Leaders, CERT Members, I wanted to give you a friendly reminder that as WA. State Citizen Corps / CERT Program Coordinator I'm adopting the New CERT Qualifications & their titles effective Jan 1, 2022. I know some teams have notified me that they are going to adopt the new qualifications and move forward with knocking off the required courses within the task books and qualifications. **PLEASE BE ADVISED, no CERT Team has to switch over and start doing the new requirements, The ONLY thing that I'm asking of all teams is this; you can only use one of three titles within the CERT Teams, 1) CERT Section Chief, 2) CERT Team Leader, 3) CERT Volunteer. This will help when CERT Teams respond to assist.** At no point are you required to do the rest of the list, I'm enclosing the new task books and qualifications for you to forward to all your teams, if you have any questions please don't hesitate to reach out, my objective here is not to make it hard on any team or organization. Thank you for your help and time with this matter.

FEMA wants to type CERT teams

- It would show same testing on all CERT Squads nationwide
- **No CERT member have to be typed.**
- **All CERTS are grandfathered into current positions**
- Only need to do requirements if you want to promote to higher position
- Requires a Task Book (This is used by all federal agencies)
- Titles Section Chief, Team Leader, CERT Volunteer.
- Local CERT group cannot add any different titles.
- Only use FEMA titles. Local CERT teams should not "type" own positions

# CERT National Resource Typing Chief Orr's Rules



- Everyone is grandfathered where they are at.
- Typing not required for CERT Participants
- To advance you will need to complete Task book for new level.
  - Meet all the requirements for the new level
  - Complete training required for new level
- Each of our levels is mapped into the 3 Typing levels
  - CERT Volunteer
    - Squad Leader (Type 1)
    - Advanced CERT Members & Squad Leader in training (Type 2)
  - CERT Team Leader
    - Division Chief (Type 1) \* Section Chief Required
    - Captain (Type 2)
  - CERT Section Chief
    - Division Chief (One Type) \* See Above
    - Administrative Support Functions (This is not Scribes)

Administrative positions are those high-level support position like Cindy Zechenelly
